**PLANT QUARANTINE ACT
(CAP. 433)**

**Plant Quarantine (Harmful Organisms) Amendment
Regulations, 2009**

IN exercise of the powers conferred by article 32 of the Plant Quarantine Act, the Minister for Resources and Rural Affairs has made the following rules:-

1. (1) The title of these regulations is the Plant Quarantine (Harmful Organisms) Amendment Regulations, 2009 and they shall be read and construed as one with the Plant Quarantine (Harmful Organisms) Regulations 2004, hereinafter referred to as “the principal regulations”. Title and scope.

(2) The scope of these regulations is to transpose Commission Directive 2008/109/EC of 28 November, 2008 amending Directive 2000/29/EC.

2. Section I in Part A of Schedule IV to the principal regulations shall be amended as follows: Amends Schedule IV to the principal regulations.

(a) for point 2 thereof there shall be substituted the following:

Wood packaging material, in the form of packing cases, boxes, crates, drums and similar packings, pallets, box pallets and other load boards, pallet collars, actually in use in the transport of objects of all kinds, except raw wood of 6 mm thickness or less, and processed wood produced by glue, heat and pressure, or a combination thereof, coming from third countries, except Switzerland.</p> | <p>The wood packaging material shall:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> — be free from bark with the exception of any number of individual pieces of bark if they are either less than 3 cm in width (regardless of the length) or, if greater than 3 cm in width, of not more than 50 cm² in area, and — be subject to one of the approved treatments as specified in Annex I to FAO International Standard for Phytosanitary Measures No 15 on <i>Guidelines for regulating wood packaging material in international trade</i>, and — display a mark as specified in Annex II to FAO International Standard for |

Wood used to wedge or support non-wood cargo, including that which has not kept its natural round surface, except raw wood of 6 mm thickness or less and processed wood produced by glue, heat and pressure, or a combination thereof, coming from third countries, except Switzerland.</p> | <p>The wood shall:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> — be free from bark with the exception of any number of individual pieces of bark if they are either less than 3 cm in width (regardless of the length) or, if greater than 3 cm in width, of not more than 50 cm² in area, and — be subject to one of the approved treatments as specified in Annex I to FAO International Standard for Phytosanitary Measures No 15 on <i>Guidelines for regulating wood packaging material in international trade</i>, and — display a mark as specified in Annex II to FAO International Standard for Phytosanitary Measures No 15 on <i>Guidelines for regulating wood packaging material in international trade</i>, indicating that the wood has been subjected to an approved phytosanitary treatment. <p>The first indent shall only apply from 1 July, 2009.”.</p> |
